  Sunday arrows are orange and black.


  Portions of the trail are used on both days so watch your colours !!!

LAST YEAR'S GAS TRUCKS

#### 1953 CORDUROY

It was Canada's first two day Endurance Run. The start was at the Glen Eagles Hotel just east of Toronto (it's still there by the way). Bring enough money to buy gas for 500 miles!

We were told Saturday's route would zig-zag up through southern Ontario to scenic Haliburton, where we would spend the night at Les North's luxurious Gold Rock Lodge. Sunday would be another 250 mile route back to Toronto.

Sounded like just the challenge for a teenager on a 500 Norton twin who had already completed two road enduros!

Some of the other machines were "real" dirt bikes with knobby tires, high exhausts and no batteries. Many were regular road bikes like mine with lights, mufflers, batteries, etc. removed and a Grasshopper rear tire installed (not enough room for a knobby). And some were completely stock road machines! They were mostly English motorcycles: 200 cc "Devoid-of-Power" two-strokes and 350 to 1000 cc four-strokes some weighing 500 pounds!

Saturday proved too long and tough for much of the entry as they ran out of daylight! But most of them did manage to straggle into Gold Rock, the ones without lights being led by those with. After 10 to 12 hours of riding a 400 pound motorcycle with 3½ inch travel, Gold Rock really was luxurious, especially the steam bath!

Some of the riders would have preferred not to ride Sunday, but eventually did because they had to ride back to Toronto anyway -- the few trailers and pick-ups were already full, and the Van hadn't been invented yet!

By today's standards the 1953 trails were easy, but because of the machines used then and the length of the course, it truly was an Endurance Run!

In 1953 (the year of the first Corduroy Enduro) the winner was Basil Jackson of Toronto on a 500 Triumph.


In 1955, 1966, 1967 Bill Sharpless won the enduros on a 650 Ariel and 250 Bultaco

This year it could be you !!! THIRTY YEARS LATER... 1985
























SOUTH OF THE BORDER COMPETITION

### CORDUROY ENDURO Spectator Sheet and Gas Stop Sept. 20, 21 / 1986

#### SATURDAY

1. Start -- Bill's Hill's Wilberforce 11:00 a.m. - 12:30

29.1 km.

2. GAS STOP # 1 -- Gooderham -- From Bill's Hill's turn left (south) onto highway 648. Follow Highway south to TORY HILL. BEAR left ( onto highway 503 to GOODERHAM. Turn left (south) onto highway 507 and go 0.1 km to Contau Lake Road. Gas is at the intersection of Contau Lake Road and highway 507.

Keytime 12:37 11:37

3. GAS STOP # 2 -- Catchacoma -- From Gas stop #1, continue south on highway 507 28.9 km. Then turn right (west) onto a Fire Access Road (gravel road located 1.9 km south of Trapper Inn). Continue 100 yards and park on north side of road in parking lot.

#### Keytime 153 12:53

4. SPECTATOR POINT -- WATER HOLE -- Five point parking lot 11.3 km north of Gas # 2; 2.2 km north of Baldwin Bay Road or 2.5 km south of the Pencil Lake Road on highway 507. Park in lot and walk south on trail 300 yards to water hole. Watch for oncoming riders!!

#### Keytime 2:27 1:27

5. SPECTATOR POINT -- IRONDALE RIVER CROSSING -- 3.3 km east of Tory Hill turn south off highway 121 onto Hadlington road. Drive 3.5 km and SEAR west onto unmarked road. Proceed 1.5 km to trail on left. Watch for arrows and oncoming riders. Walk in trail to river crossing.

6. Finish and Cross Country Special Test at Bill's Hill's in Wilberforce.

SPECTATOR POINT -- BURNT RIVER CROSSING -- North from Kinmount on highway 121 to Haliburton #1. North on Haliburton #1 and turn right onto road just south of Gelert Gardens Diner. Proceed on this road and turn right onto the second road you come to, cross the abandoned RR line and park. Walk east through gate for a mile to river.




